

OUR MISSION

To provide high standard welfare, support and accommodation services to blind and vision impaired people while promoting independence, dignity and quality of life.

OUR STORY

It was during the Depression years of the 1930's that the blind of South Australia formed their own organisation, the Blind Welfare Association (BWA). For over 75 years the Association has continued to provide a range of services such as financial assistance, social support, advocacy, welfare and accommodation for people who are blind or vision impaired.

ELIGIBILITY

The majority of BWA services are covered by a life membership fee of \$10.00. Our services are available to any individual who is legally blind and resides in South Australia. People with low vision (not legally blind) are encouraged to become Associate members of BWA. Associate members pay an annual fee.

SERVICES FINANCIAL SUPPORT SPECIAL PURPOSE WELFARE FUND

Blind Welfare Association can assist its members through subsidy for costs associated with:

- Utilities (gas, electricity, telephone)
- Interest free personal loans
- Equipment subsidy—items made exclusively for people who are blind or vision impaired
- Equipment subsidy Youth (12

 17 years), items made exclusively for people who are blind or vision impaired to assist with study or employment
- Home maintenance
- Funeral expenses
- Birth and adoption expenses

SOCIAL CENTRE

Our social centre is located at 1 Cameron Ave, Gilles Plains.
Activities include:

- Modified Tai Chi
- Audio description movies
- Social groups—concerts, outings, lunches etc
- Writers' group
- Music appreciation/singing group
- Other activities as identified or requested by members.

MARNEY PEARCE TECHNOLOGY LOUNGE

Access and training on computer applications using programs such as Jaws, Zoom Text and Dolphin Guide.

A Scanner Reader and Electronic Magnifier (CCTV) are also available.
