INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF BLIND WELFARE ASSOCIATION OF SA INC

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Blind Welfare Association of SA Inc which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 June 2016 and the income statement for the year then ended, statement of cash flows, statement of recognised income, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the members of the committee statement.

The Responsibility of The members of the Committee for the Financial Report

The members of the committee of the association are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note I to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are appropriate to meet the financial reporting requirements of the constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members and the requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (ACNC Act). The members of the committee responsibility also includes establishing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note I, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the members of the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional accounting bodies.

Auditor's Opinion

In our opinion, the financial report of Blind Welfare Association of SA Inc has been prepared in accordance with Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the registered entity's financial position as at 30 June 2016 and of its financial performance and cash flows for the year ended on that date; and
- (b) Complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note I, and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013.
